## Unpacking and setting up the vehicle



#### Packaging 2

Remove the box and the plastic packaging.



#### Info

To avoid damaging the motorcycle during assembly, leave the protective film on the vehicle until you have finished.

- Take out the separate enclosure and unpack it. Check its contents on the basis of the enclosure list.
- Set up the work stand.

Work stand (54829055000)

- Carefully loosen and remove the tensioning belt over the link fork.

An assistant prevents the motorcycle from falling over.

- Carefully loosen and remove the tensioning belts around the lower triple clamp.
  - ✓ The vehicle is released at the front.
- Together with an assistant, take the vehicle off the palette.
- Position the vehicle on a work stand.
- Check the vehicle for transport damage.

- Remove the box and the plastic packaging.



- Together with an assistant, take the vehicle off the palette.
- Position the vehicle on a work stand.
- Check the vehicle for transport damage.
- Install the shock absorber. (\* p. 9)







- Route the clutch line with the clutch master cylinder toward the front between the upper and lower triple clamps.
- Position the fork legs and tighten the screws of the triple clamp.



Screw, bottom triple clamp	M8	12 Nm (8.9 lbf ft)



#### Info

The upper milled groove in the fork leg must be flush with the top edge of the upper triple clamp.

Position bleeder screws **1** toward the front.

- Remove screws ①. Take off the handlebar clamps.
- Remove screws 2. Take off the handlebar holders.
- Move the handle bar holders to the desired position. Mount and tighten screws ②.

- Take out lower shells 6.
- Take out clamping bars **7** with cone-shaped rubber pieces **6**.
- Remove screws 9. Take off the handlebar holders.
- Move the handle bar holders to the desired position. Mount and tighten screws 9.



- Mount screws and tighten evenly.

## Removing the seat




 Remove screw ①. Lift up the seat at the rear, pull it back and then remove from above.

## Mounting the seat



- Hook in the front of the seat at the collar sleeve of the fuel tank, lower it at the rear and simultaneously push it forward.
- Make sure that the seat is correctly locked in.
- Mount and tighten the screw of the seat fixing.

## Installing the start number plate



Position the start number plate. Mount and tighten screw ①.

Take care with the contact of the holding lug at the fender.

Position the brake line. Put the clamp on, and mount and tighten screw ②.


## Installing the front wheel



#### Warning

Danger of accidents Reduced braking efficiency due to oil or grease on the brake discs.

- Always keep the brake discs free of oil and grease, and clean them with brake cleaner when necessary.



- Clean and grease shaft seal rings and bearing surface of the spacers.
  - Long-life grease (\* p. 13)
- Insert the spacers.



- Lift the front wheel into the fork, position it, and insert the wheel spindle.
- Mount and tighten screw ②.

 Operate the hand brake lever several times until the brake linings are lying correctly on the brake disc.

- Remove the motorcycle from the work stand.
- Pull the front wheel brake and push down hard on the fork several times to align the fork legs.
- Fully tighten screw 3.

## Recharging the battery



## Warning

**Risk of injury** Battery acid and battery gases cause serious cauterization.

- Keep batteries out of the reach of children.
- Wear suitable protective clothing and goggles.
- Avoid contact with battery acid and battery gases.
- Keep the battery away from sparks or open fire. Charge only in well ventilated rooms.
- In the event of skin contact, rinse with large amounts of water. If battery acid gets in the eyes, rinse with water for at least 15 minutes and contact a doctor.



#### Warning

## Info

Even if there is no load on the battery, it loses power every day.

The charge state and the type of charge are very important for the service life of the battery.


Fast recharging with a high charge current shortens the battery's service life.

If the charge current, the charge voltage and the charge time are exceeded, electrolyte escapes through the breathing holes. The battery capacity is then reduced.


If the battery is discharged from starting, it must be recharged immediately.

If it stands for a long time in a discharged state, the battery becomes over-discharged and sulfated, and then it is destroyed.

The battery is maintenance-free, i.e., the acid level does not have to be checked.



- Remove the seat. (\* p. 7)
- Disconnect the minus (negative) cable of the battery to avoid damage to the motor-cycle's electronics.
- Connect the battery charger to the battery. Switch on the battery charger.



You can also use the battery charger to test the open-circuit voltage and cranking power of the battery, and to test the generator. With this device, you cannot overcharge the battery.





Info

Never remove the lid **①**.


Charge the battery with at most 10% of the capacity specified on the battery



- Reconnect the rubber band ①.
- Attach the plus cable and replace the plus pole cover ②.
- Attach the minus cable 3.
- Mount the seat. (\* p. 7)

## Installing the shock absorber



Push splash protector • to the side and position the shock absorber. Mount and tighten screw •.




#### Info

The heim joint for the shock absorber at the swing arm is Teflon coated. It must not be greased with grease or with other lubricants. Lubricants dissolve the Teflon coating, thereby drastically reducing the service life.

- Remove the motorcycle from the work stand.

## Installing the front fender



- Ensure that the spacing sleeves are mounted in the fender.
- Position the front fender. Mount and tighten screws •.





## Opening filler cap



 Press release button •, turn filler cap counterclockwise and lift it upwards and remove.

## Closing filler cap



- Replace the filler cap and turn clockwise until the release button ● locks in place.

Route the fuel tank breather hose ② without kinking.

## Refueling



## Danger

Fire hazard Fuel is highly flammable.

- Never refuel the vehicle near open flames or burning cigarettes, and always switch off the engine first. Be careful that no fuel is spilt, especially on hot vehicle components. Clean up spilt fuel immediately.
- Fuel in the fuel tank expands when warm and can escape if the tank is overfilled. See the notes on refueling.



#### Varning

**Danger of poisoning** Fuel is poisonous and a health hazard.


Avoid contact of the fuel with skin, eyes and clothing. Do not inhale fuel vapors. If fuel gets into your eyes, rinse immediately with water and contact a doctor. Wash affected skin areas immediately with soap and water. If fuel is swallowed, contact a doctor immediately. Change clothing that has come into contact with fuel.



#### Warning

**Environmental hazard** Improper handling of fuel is a danger to the environment.

- Do not allow fuel to get into the ground water, the ground, or the sewage system.
